

Medical examination before a dog show

According to § 10 section 2 of the Animal Welfare Dog Ordinance, it is prohibited to exhibit dogs in which, due to genetic reasons:

- body parts or organs are missing or are unsuitable for proper use of the species or have been altered, resulting in pain, suffering or damage
- and**
- behavioral disorders associated with suffering occur,
- any species-appropriate contact with conspecifics causes them or a conspecific pain or avoidable suffering or harm.

A veterinary clinical examination should be carried out to determine whether there are any indications of the presence of characteristics in accordance with Section 10 (2) of the Animal Welfare Dog Ordinance in the dog.
